Cyberabad Police Commissioner, Mr Sandeep Shandilya IPS and Joint Commissioner of Police Mr Stephen Ravindra, along with their team, have conducted a review meeting of all private security agencies operating in IT corridor. They have reviewed the agencies on various parameters as per their PSARA license terms, like deploying right security guards, recruiting norms, training norms, working hours, issues they are facing etc. The purpose of the meeting is to equip them better and in turn create a good support structure to the industry. JCP Mr Stephen Ravindra has reviewed all the private security agencies to understand the preparedness of all agencies and review the adherence norms as laid down in PSARA act. The security agencies have been briefed about the necessary actions they need to undertake during bomb threats, bomb threat calls, any intrusions or snipers etc.

JCP Mr Stephen Ravindra in his address, said, there will be a training organized for all PSARA licensed security agency heads shortly and this will be communicated to them – so as to enable all of them to get the benefit of TSPA's training. He also has assured all the agencies to look in to their issues like Arm license etc. Agencies have urged the JCP Mr Stephen Ravindra to display the PSARA license agency names on Cyberabad Police commission's website and he assured that it will be done. The licensed agencies have urged CP to make the PSARA license a mandatory requirement for all organizations before deploying any security agency.

Mr Bharani K Aroll, Secretary in his address said that each of the companies need to collaborate and partner with each other for better security preparedness and improved visibility. He also said that the society will invest and work along with Octopus team to create a good AV training material to ensure that the effective training reaches to all security guards.

DCP Mr Viswa Prasad urged all agencies to apply for PSARA license immediately and assured them that all pending applications for license will be reviewed.
